

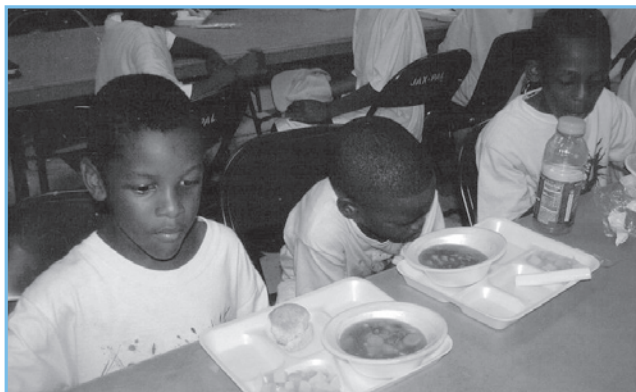

## Food Safety Tip:

Dry foods should be stored at least six inches off the floor, away from the walls, in a clean, dry, pest-free and secured environment and out of direct sunlight. Foods should be stored on clean plastic or stainless steel pallets, shelving units or mobile racks.
