Empowering Communities Since 1979

Lutheran Social Services of Northeast Florida (LSS) was established in 1979 by Lutheran churches and community leaders. Initially, it began with the Nourishment Network, a food pantry helping foodinsecure families for over 40 years. Soon after, LSS expanded to support refugees escaping dangerous circumstances, offering housing and employment assistance.

LSS grew its reach with programs like the Advocacy, Care & Education (ACE) initiative in 1992, offering support and education for those living with HIV/AIDS. Its partnership with CAN Community Health in 2018 further expanded HIV services in Northeast Florida.

In 1995, LSS established Representative Payee Services to manage the finances of low-income individuals, ensuring their basic needs are met.

The agency launched Steps 2 Success (S2S), Florida's inaugural Financial Opportunity Center, in December 2017. S2S integrates no-cost career and financial coaching, along with income support, to empower individuals in achieving their financial goals.

Since relocating to its Philips Highway location, LSS has housed independent nonprofits like CAN Community Health, Vision is Priceless, JaxCareConnect, and WeCareJax, each offering distinct services.

This diverse network of nonprofits at one location forms a convenient hub for individuals to address. multiple needs, fostering a comprehensive support network.

Hunger Relief

Food for 2,000+ households every month through our onsite food pantry, and additional feeding initiatives for seniors and school children.

Refugee Resettlement

Resettlement, case management, employment & tutoring for those who have fled war & persecution in their home countries for the safety of a new life in the U.S.

Steps 2 Success



Providing free, holistic financial and career coaching to help those meet their financial goals, which include budgeting, debt management and building credit.

HIV Services

Wraparound services for those who are HIV+, including housing, case management, mental health, and access to an onsite clinic and pharmacy.

Representative Payee Services

Rep Payees manage finances for vulnerable individuals, ensuring basic needs are met and safequarding against exploitation.





Agency expenses by program












Impact At-A-Glance Serving Over 44,000 In 2023

Feeding Programs



Food Pantry

The LSS Food Pantry at 4615 Philips Highway fed over 40,000 people in 2023. No appointments needed; visit once a month with ID. Open Monday to Friday, 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. for food distribution at the back of the building.



Backpack Program

Supporting students on free or reduced-fee lunches by providing weekend meals and snacks across 15 schools in Duval and Clay counties. In 2023, the program has provided 18,810 bags of food to students.



Serving Our Seniors (SOS)

Ensuring groceries reach 540 low-income seniors monthly. SOS prioritizes delivering essential groceries to support elderly individuals in need.

The Representative Payee Program's mission is all about managing funds for those who might not handle their finances well. LSS is the only agency in Northeast Florida that offers Representative Payee Services.

Why the Program Exists

Managing personal finances can be challenging for anyone. In some cases, a lack of financial understanding and skill can lead to serious problems, like the cutoff of utilities or eviction.

For people with mental illnesses, developmental disabilities, substance abuse problems or other challenges, this can begin the cycle of homelessness.

How LSS Payees Help

Fiscal coordinators help clients set budgets, pay their bills for basic living expenses and give them spending stipends. The program serves an average of nearly 600 people each month, ensuring they are living in safe environments while getting the ongoing support they need.

Career & Financial Coaching Creating Pathways to Financial Prosperity



Steps 2 Success (S2S), Jacksonville's first Financial Opportunity Center, equips participants with essential tools for financial and life stabilization.

Although open to all seeking financial security, most clients reside in the historically redlined New Town Success Zone (32209).

In 2023, \$25 provided its services to 117 people. Eighteen individuals graduated from the inaugural Matched Saving program, which helped participants increase their savings and assets. In November, \$25 launched its Utility Assistance Benefit to new participants in light of increased living costs and to relieve some financial burden.

Clients in 2023 increased their credit score by an average of 75 points, a 35% increase compared to last year. On average, participants increased their monthly net income by \$1,200, or 27% more than 2022.

The office is adjacent to Edwards Waters University, and aims to serve the New Town Success Zone neighborhood, ensuring easy access to vital services.

S2S founders strategically placed the center to counter generational poverty by offering career and financial coaching, addressing key obstacles faced by residents in 32209.

Kimba's journey from homelessness to stability with Lutheran Social Services' Steps 2 Success (S2S) program showcases resilience and unwavering support. After a chance encounter with S2S, Kimba embarked on a transformative path. With coaching, resources, and determination, she secured employment, housing, and financial stability within a year.



The Refugee Resettlement program of LSS aids refugees who can't return to their home countries upon reaching the US. Formed in 1980 in response to an influx of Southeast Asian refugees in Jacksonville, LSS been a vital support system.

Refugee resettlement supports people fleeing political or religious persecution, famine, war, natural disasters, or instability. Those seeking a fresh start in our country receive assistance from LSS, including life-skills training, connection to English classes, job placements, and family and youth support services.

Refugees, referred by Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS), are resettled by LSS, whose staff members speak various languages and hail from diverse countries.

The ultimate aim is to foster refugees' long-term economic self-sufficiency and ensure their successful integration into American society as productive members, be they refugees, entrants, or asylees.



LSS helps people excel through its Refugee Youth Services, like Sahar! In June 2021, she and her family moved from Afghanistan to Jacksonville in order to flee the Taliban. Sahar had missed a year of schooling, and started her 11th grade year struggling with her grades. Now, a year later, her grades improved, and she was accepted into the National Honor Society in October 2023.

The ACE (Advocacy, Care & Education) program at LSS provides assistance to families and people who are living with HIV through case management, counseling support, rent and utility assistance and outreach services.

In 1992, LSS expanded into addressing health-related issues in the Jacksonville community by establishing the ACE (Advocacy, Care & Education) Program.

Through this program, great strides have been made in the overall viral suppression in Jacksonville.

In 2023, the viral suppression rate for our clients was 91%, meaning that 91 out of 100 of our clients are not able to spread the virus through sexual contact. The national HIV viral suppression rate is 66%, according to a 2021 CDC study.*

The ACE staff assisted 972 people with all aspects relating to their medical well-being such as finding appropriate medical treatment sites, keeping clients' appointments, moving them into homes and apartments, and obtaining personal care items.

In November 2022, Walldeline, an HIV-positive individual, joined Lutheran Social Services' ACE Program for support. The LSS HIV support group became her sanctuary, nurturing her voice and resilience within the HIV community. Using TikTok, she fearlessly raised HIV awareness in English and Creole. Completing peer navigator training expanded her outreach in Central Florida. Actively advocating in the Metropolitan Jacksonville Area HIV Health Services Planning Council, she found guidance at CAN Community Health. The ACE Program empowered Walldeline, revealing her strength amid HIV challenges.
